Club Activities -

Our activities continued to be affected by the "Shelter in Place" directives. However, there still has been some limited flying on the few good and relatively wind free days we've experienced. Johnson City has been in contact with us to make sure we've not been conducting any large scale activities and has been assured that individuals have been flying and practicing "Social Distancing".

It's lonely when you have to look for lost sheep by yourself.



We will continue to take our cues from how Johnson City itself begins its return to communal activities.

Even Without a Formal Work Day-

Over the past month a few items that have needed to be done have been completed. These iinclude cutting away the large pieces of a tree that fell close to the edge of the roadway into the facility and placing the pieces as a barrier aeround the drainage culvert close to the entrance area, putting a drip edge over the doors to the lrge shed to stop water seeping into the shed, repairing a hole in the large shed roof and screwing down the shed's ridge vent that had worked loose, sealing the skylight in the charging shed and collecting some five buckets oof rocks from along the edge of the runway. We can thank Phil Swihart for most of that effort, especially the rock removal; he collects a bucket of rocks each time he comes out to the field.

But, that's not all the new Vice President has done. Phil made a survey of tasks that need to be done at the field to keep the airfield and associated assets in operational condition. He then identified the items with a priority for attention:

- Priority 1: Items identified as Priority 1, require immediate action, because their present condition is a threat to Airfield asset and property. These items if not repaired, will cause greater near-term damage with escalated costs.
- Priority 2: Items identified as Priority 2, do not pose an immediate risk to the Airfield assets or property. These are items whose condition is not ideal. These items will migrate up to Priority 1 as their condition worsens or usage of the item increases.
- Priority 3: Items identified as Priority 3, do not pose any risk to the Airfield assets or property, however, these items add to the beautification and operational condition of the Airfield.

Phil believes that permanent fixes to Priority 1 items will require approximately \$200.00 and some volunteer hours and that cost can be reduced if materials were to be donated by club members. His list is below:




