Club Activities -

Tim couldn't stand the change for Chill and Grill to set up on the Concrete Pad in front of the small Grey Shed. So he dragged the Grill back to its place of honor and everybody did their best to not crowd each other. We'll still work on getting the wooden picnic tables repaired and painted and maybe setting them up adjacent to the Pad.





It was a little windy, but people still braved the setting sun to fly. Even Tim got the chance to get one in the air for a while. Unfortunately, there were a couple of crashes and several of us encountered a demon of a down draft when making the turn to line up to land on Runway 2 (landing right to left).

With twelve members, we had an acceptable start, especially considering the short time we had to let members know we're back in operation and we expect that the participation will increase as the summer continues.

Club Activities -

The first **Summer Work Day** at the field was a big success! With around a dozen people pitching in (we even had a new member show up), everything on the Vice President's list with the exception of painting two wooden pic-nic tables and one set of bleachers got done and those weren't due to lack of people or time but running out of **Green** paint!

Up at the Pavilion, The flight control box (Station) was repaired and freshly painted in Grey and Green and shifted about 2 inches inboard then re-secured. The long steel topped table under the Pavilion got fresh paint as did the Charging Table in the Charging Shed. The rotted rake boards on the pavilion were removed and replaced with new, painted trim and fresh paint put on the runway facing eves.





Out on the Flight Line, the North Steel Charging Table got fresh paint, the North Bleachers got fresh Black and Green Paint, and all the flight tables got scrapped and fresh Green paint with new Orange Wing Stop padding installed on the uprights. Elsewhere, the red markings on the T-33 were scrapped and repainted, leaving only the flat black to be done.

All in All, a lot of needed maintenance was accomplished and things are looking good!! Many hands meant that most tasks were done before noon and everyone was finished by 2PM. Thanks to Phil for planning, positioning supplies and executing the day so well.















AMA/FAA Update -

AMA posted the following update on 22 May. Bolded text andded by me for emphasis:

clove nment Affairs Update 5/22/2020

The AMA Government Affairs team continues to work with Congress and the FAA despite the ongoing pandemic. We have been able to conduct telephone meetings and participate in virtual video conferencing in order to continue our efforts to advocate for the hobby. In the past few weeks, we have seen developments that will impact our hobbyist community. Throughout the last year, we have been working with clubs in controlled airspace to secure Letters of Agreement (LOA) with local air traffic control (ATC) facilities. In the last few weeks, we have been able to get many of these mutually agreed—upon LOAs signed and we are happy to see that this process is progressing more quickly. In addition to securing LOAs for our clubs, we have also secured a path for night operations at fixed flying sites in controlled airspace. To streamline the LOA process for our clubs, the FAA is working to finalize a LOA checklist that will be used in its ATC manuals.

We continue to conduct Safety Risk Management panels for clubs in controlled airspace that need to fly over the FAA UAS Facility Map altitude. The clubs that have gone through this process have been successful and are being approved for their requested altitudes. This process highlights potential safety risks and results in identifying safety mitigations in order to continue our safe operations.

We are being told that Advisory Circular (AC) 91-57C will be out for public comment sometime soon, and the FAA is working to finalize this AC sometime this calendar year. This AC will include an **outline for community-based organization recognition** and the **recreational Knowledge and Safety test**. In addition, we are hearing rumors that the FAA is on schedule for a **final rule on Remote ID by the end of the calendar year**. Recreational operators had a large impact during the comment period on the NPRM. We have heard that there were many identified issues with the rule that will need better solutions, which include cost, broadcast abilities and FAA Recognized Identification Areas. Again, thank you to everyone who commented on the NPRM.
